A Taste of Herbs & Spices
Flavors of Health Nutrition Program
The LSU AgCenter and LSU provide equal opportunities in programs and employment.

Hypertension, or high blood pressure, increases the risk for heart disease and can be a precursor to other health risks. The Louisiana Department of Health reports that many adults over 55 in Ouachita Parish have heart disease. Eating a low-sodium diet is a great way to help lower blood pressure, and a great way to limit salt intake is to start cooking with more herbs and spices.

Flavors of Health is a nutrition initiative from the LSU AgCenter that encourages Louisiana cooks to do just that. "A Taste of Herbs and Spices" at the Louise Williams Branch Library will feature a new herb or spice each month with an informational handout and a sample to try at home and occasional cooking demonstrations from Flavors of Health Agent Markaye Russell. Flavors of Health aims to engage our communities by providing nutrition and food education that support healthy eating.

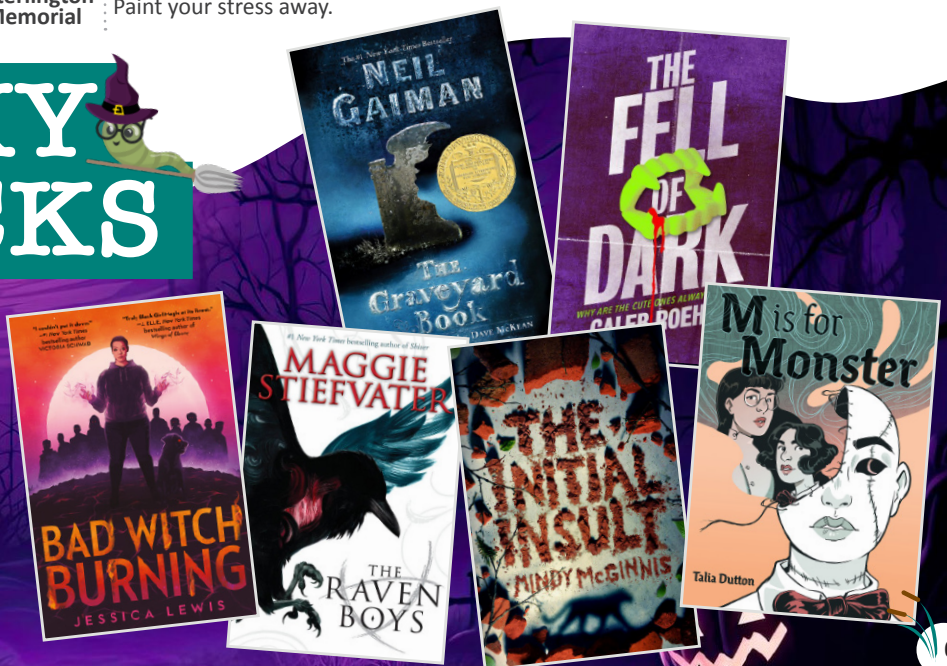

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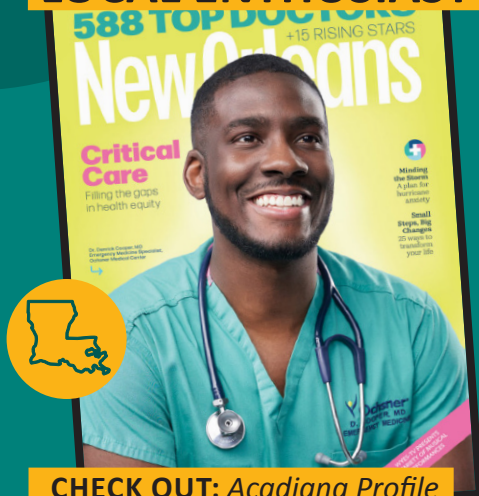

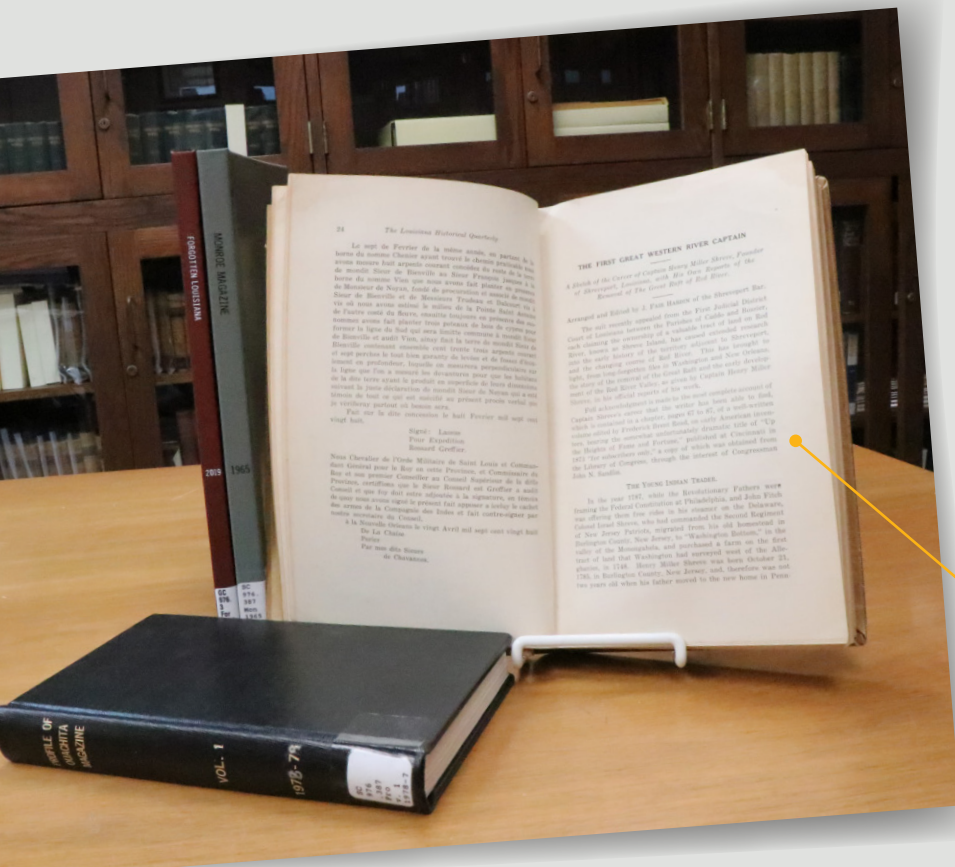

MAGAZINES, JOURNALS AND NEWSLETTERS IN GENEALOGY



The Genealogy and Special Collections Department has a variety of periodical publications available for patrons to browse. There are magazines that appeal to a general audience, journals that are more scholarly, and newsletters that provide information to a targeted audience. The Northeast Louisiana Genealogical and Historical Society, our local society, publishes *Lost Louisiana*, a journal of local genealogy and history. *Cattails* is the Ouachita Parish Public Library newsletter that is designed for Ouachita Parish Public Library patrons.

The *Louisiana Historical Quarterly* is a publication of the Louisiana Historical Society that was founded in 1835. Genealogy has bound issues from 1917 to 1956 and a few scattered issues from the 1960s. Genealogy also has *Louisiana History*, the journal of the Louisiana Historical Association from 1960 to the present. The National Genealogy Society publishes the *National Genealogical Society Quarterly* and the *NGS Magazine*. The Quarterly provides detailed articles from specific genealogy research and often includes historical documentation. The Magazine provides helpful articles of interest to all levels of researcher – from beginner to advanced. *Family Tree Magazine* by Yankee Publishing provides helpful articles on how to begin genealogy research and what sources can be used. It includes tips on using the latest technology.

There are periodicals published by local genealogical societies. A few popular ones include the *Mississippi River Routes*, *Kinfolks* and the *Natchitoches Genealogist*. *Mississippi River Routes* is a quarterly publication of the Vicksburg Genealogical Society. It contains information on the early Mississippi areas of Natchez, Vicksburg, Lake Providence, Vidalia and Tallulah. *Kinfolks* is published by the Southwest Louisiana Genealogy Society and *The Natchitoches Genealogist* is published by the Natchitoches Genealogical and Historical Society. These periodicals



are great if you have ancestors who lived or passed through those areas.

Special Collections has historic issues of the *Profile of Ouachita* magazine (1978-1986) and the *Monroe Magazine* (1965-1968). Main Branch also has periodicals that pertain to local history and culture. *The Historic New Orleans Collection Quarterly* and 64 Parishes, published by the Louisiana Endowment for the Humanities are housed with other periodicals at Main Branch. Please remember that we have great periodicals the next time you visit the library.
