
The platform includes hundreds of educational videos covering subjects like science, humanities, business and finance, teaching and more.

HISTORY OF THE BRANCHES; LIBRARY CARDS THEN AND NOW

September is Library Card Sign-Up Month. Registration cards have been used to manage circulation of library materials since at least May 1931, according to Library board minutes. During the April 6, 1937, board meeting, members decided that the 25-cent fee for borrowers' cards would be discontinued. It was reported in the next meeting, May 28, 1937, that the increase in circulation was a result of the discontinuation of the charge for a library card. There is still no charge for a library card that can be used at any branch location.

Anna Meyer – 418 Jackson Street, named for Anna Ruth Meyer, who left her home to the library, when the Main Branch opened at 1800 Stubbs, the Jackson Street location became known as the Anna Meyer branch. This branch relocated to 1808 U.S. Highway 165 South, Monroe, in 1994 **Bookmobile** – mobile branch service began in 1948, van service was added in 1989

Carver-McDonald - opened as Carver Branch at 109 ½ Powell's Alley in February of 1949, moved to 116 North 10th Street, Monroe in February of 1950, moved to 2941 Renwick Street in December of 1964, named after scientist and inventor George Washington Carver, and in 2009 renamed Carver-McDonald in honor of Odalie McDonald, the first Carver Branch and African-American librarian in the public library system.

Cpl. J.R. Searcy Memorial – opened in 2011 at 5775 Jonesboro Road, West Monroe, named for Corporal Clovis Wayne "J.R." Searcy, Jr., an officer with the Ouachita Parish Sheriff's Office who died in 2010 in the line of duty. Monroe Morning World, October 1969 (clipping - Library Card Usage)

> Your Library card is the passport to the world of reading. If you do not have one now, apply at one of the libraries very soon.

Monroe Morning World, June 1965 (clipping - Library Card is a passport to the world) Ouachita Parish residents with library cards may use the cards, at any branch, and books may be returned to any branch, according to Librarian Miss Frances Flanders.

Louise Williams – opened in 2005 at 140 Bayou Oaks Drive, Monroe, Grady Williams, a retired Ouachita Parish Police Juror, donated the land in memory of his late wife, Louise Pepper Williams.

Main – the Monroe Public Library opened in 1916 at 119 Wood Street, Monroe, moved to 418 Jackson Street in 1921, became the Ouachita Parish Public Library in 1940, and 1959 opened at 1800 Stubbs Avenue.

Ollie Burns Memorial – opened in 2010 at 5601 Hwy 165

By-Pass, Richwood, named for Ollie Burns, the first African American to serve on the Ouachita Parish Library Board of Control and the first African American graduate of the Louisiana State University Library School.

Ouachita Valley – opened in 1977 at 601 McMillan Road.

Sterlington Memorial – opened in 2007 at 305 Keystone Road, Monroe, named after the onemillion-dollar contribution from the 1991 Angus Chemical Plant explosion settlement.

West Monroe – opened at 307 Wood Street, West Monroe in 1941, moved to the corner of Natchitoches and Cypress Street in 1946, and then to 315 Cypress Street in 1958.

West Ouachita – opened in 2001 at 188 Hwy 546, West Monroe.

> School Children Urged To Get Library Cards

All school children in Ouachita parish were urged by their teachers to secure library cards this summer in order that they might borrow books at the public libraries. During the month of June, children have flocked to the libraries in order to take advantage of the attractive and interesting books available for them. The fact that a total of 2.300 books were checked out to children during the first month of their vacation, reveals that children appreciate more than ever before the worthwhile books which are now at their disposal.

Since its organization in 1916, the Monroe Public library has recognized the importance of fine children's books and has continually added to its juvenile collection.

Each year two outstanding awards are made in the field of juvenile literature—the Newberry and Caldecott awards. The Newberry award, given for the most distinguished contribution to American literature for children, was presented this year to Elizabeth Janet Gray for her book "Adam of the Road," a delightful story of 13th century England about a minstrel boy who loses both his father and his dog, and sets out along the great highways to find them.
