LIFELONG LITERACY & YOUR LIBRARY

NIRALI PATEL Monroe City Main Street Director

As a child of immigrants and a first generation American, I have spent my entire life learning. It was so important to my dad that I found a love for reading and getting an education. My parents never had the opportunity to receive an education, let alone pursue their passions, but they knew that both were important pillars to a happy life.

I remember my first day of second grade like it was yesterday. We had just been assigned seats to our tiny desks and begun to settle down when our teacher, Mrs. Placke, started our announcements. She excitedly told us about all the wonderful things that we would get to do in class through our school library, including reading independently and taking AR tests. I immediately panicked because I didn't know how to read. When Mrs. Placke looked over at me, she saw the fear in my eyes (probably the tears too), she just smiled and said, "If you don't know if you can do that, it will be okay."

That was a crossroads moment, something that could have completely changed the trajectory of my life. She intentionally chose to work with me every single day, teaching me the skills that I should've learned in first grade but did not. She worked with me in the school library with patience and kindness and always rewarded my hard work with turning on an episode of Reading Rainbow with Levar Burton. As a child, I remember the pure excitement I felt when hearing the theme song and knowing I was about to listen to this wonderful man speak about the joys of reading and be genuinely happy about it.

I went from being a kid who couldn't read a picture book on her own to reading chapter books in a very short amount of time. I was one of the top readers that year, getting more AR points than any of us in our second grade class could have dreamt.

If it wasn't for this spark, I wouldn't be where I am today – I am the first female in my family to graduate high school and go on to ULM to finish my Undergraduate degree in English and Masters in Public Administration. I had the wonderful experience of meeting LeVar in 2016 to tell him that he truly helped change my life. I am grateful to have completed research and been published with other amazing scholars while working for the CIty of Monroe as Main Street Director to help revitalize my hometown.

There're skills I learned from watching the librarians in my local library and Mrs. Placke that go far beyond reading. They taught me how to observe the public in my career today and fill in the gaps where I saw a need for connectivity and education in our community. They inspired me to be patient, read between the lines to get a full understanding of what a person needs to succeed, and become the change I want to see in my community.

It's been over 20 years and I still remember how their encouragement inspired me to reach my full reading potential and what that can do to help the next generations of readers. Libraries and the people in them have the ability to change lives – and I am living proof of that.




PROMOTING LITERACY


The advancement of literacy has always been a part of the mission of the Ouachita Parish Public Library. When we think about literacy, we often think of children's services. Many people use the library most when they are children or when they have children and grandchildren to take to the library. Parents and grandparents who read to and with their children help make reading a "fun" activity which also helps improve important reading skills.

John Newbery is considered the father of Children's Literature. He published A Pretty Pocket-Book Intended for the Instruction and Amusement of Little Master Tommy and Pretty Miss Polly in 1744.

Hans Christian Anderson collected over 3,300 fairy tales to which the Brothers Grimm published two volumes in 1812 and 1815 of 156 tales, though they were not illustrated until later. In 1816, E.T.A. Hoffman published The Nutcracker and the Mouse King, a German collection of fantastic stories. In 1865, Lewis Carroll published Alice's Adventures in Wonderland. As more children's books, especially picture books, were published, literacy rates improved.

By the 1920s, publishing houses had children's departments specializing in early life literature. Early authors such as Louisa May Alcott, E.B. White, Maurice Sendack, and Dr. Seuss helped many young readers advance their reading skills.

That collection contains early editions of *Through the Looking Glass*, published by Lewis Carroll in 1875 and *Little Saint Elizabeth & Other Stories* published in 1891 by Frances Hodgson Burnett – who is also the author of The Secret Garden.

The oldest children's book in the Library is from the *McGuffey's New Eclectic Reader* series that was first published in the 1830s to teach literacy skills. Students started with the first reader and progressed through the set, building on previously taught skills, finally reaching advanced levels suitable for high school.

The Library has an 1866 copy of the *McGuffey's New Fifth Eclectic Reader* and there are also 1896 editions of the first, second, third, and fourth level readers.

In terms of circulation figures, the oldest monthly circulation report housed in the Archives collection is from January 1936. The library circulated 4050 items that month with 1070 (almost 1/3) being juvenile items.

Although we don't have a total number of borrowers, that month, 19 adult borrowers were added and 50 juvenile borrowers were added. Children's services were important back then when the library was known as Monroe Public Library and there was only one physical location.

Children's services are still important to this day at the Ouachita Parish Public Library. There are programs for infants through teens. Children's and young adult books circulate in great numbers, and our respective Summer and Winter Reading Challenge activities showcase the commitment to advancing literacy in Ouachita parish.
