

WHAT'S IN A NAME? LOUIS LOCK NOT LOCKE



The meeting room at the Ouachita Parish Public Library is named for Louis Lock – that is Lock without the "e". John Locke, the philosopher, and political theorist spelled his name with the "e". But we know from primary source documents that our Louis Lock was in fact "Lock". Lock's draft registration card lists his birth as July 18, 1876, in Russia, his address as 910 St. John Street, and that he was a naturalized citizen engaged in oil development. His wife was Mrs. Sarah Lock. Louis Lock was described as tall, of medium build with light brown eyes and black hair.

Lock lived in El Dorado, Arkansas before settling in Monroe. He did much to bring natural gas to Northeast Louisiana. He discovered the Monroe gas field and was a trustee and large shareholder of the Louisiana-Arkansas Oil and Development Company. Lock's death was attributed to



the Spanish Flu epidemic of 1918-1919. He died of pneumonia on October 24, 1918, in Fort Worth, Texas at the age of 43 according to his death certificate. He was buried in the Jewish Cemetery in Monroe, Louisiana.

A memorial fund was established shortly after Louis Lock's death with original donors Mrs. Sol Meyer, Weaks Supply Company, Carl H. McHenry, Monroe Civic League, Henry D. Briggs, Monroe Hardware, P.M. Atkins, D. Masur, I. Baer Co., J. S. Block, and Monroe Furniture. In 1953, permission was given to use the money from the fund to improve a room of the library and designate it the "Louis Lock Room". Frances

Flanders, librarian, had a bronze tablet placed above the fireplace at the library to honor Lock. That plaque is now on the door of the Main Branch meeting room.

It is not unusual to find various spellings of words from local history. One of the earliest area newspapers was the Washita Gazette and on many early maps, Ouachita was spelled Washita. Monroe is sometimes spelled Munroe even though President James Monroe and the steamboat, James Monroe, were named Monroe. It is important to consider various ways names can be spelled when researching genealogy and to go back to the primary documents to be as accurate as possible with a name.


